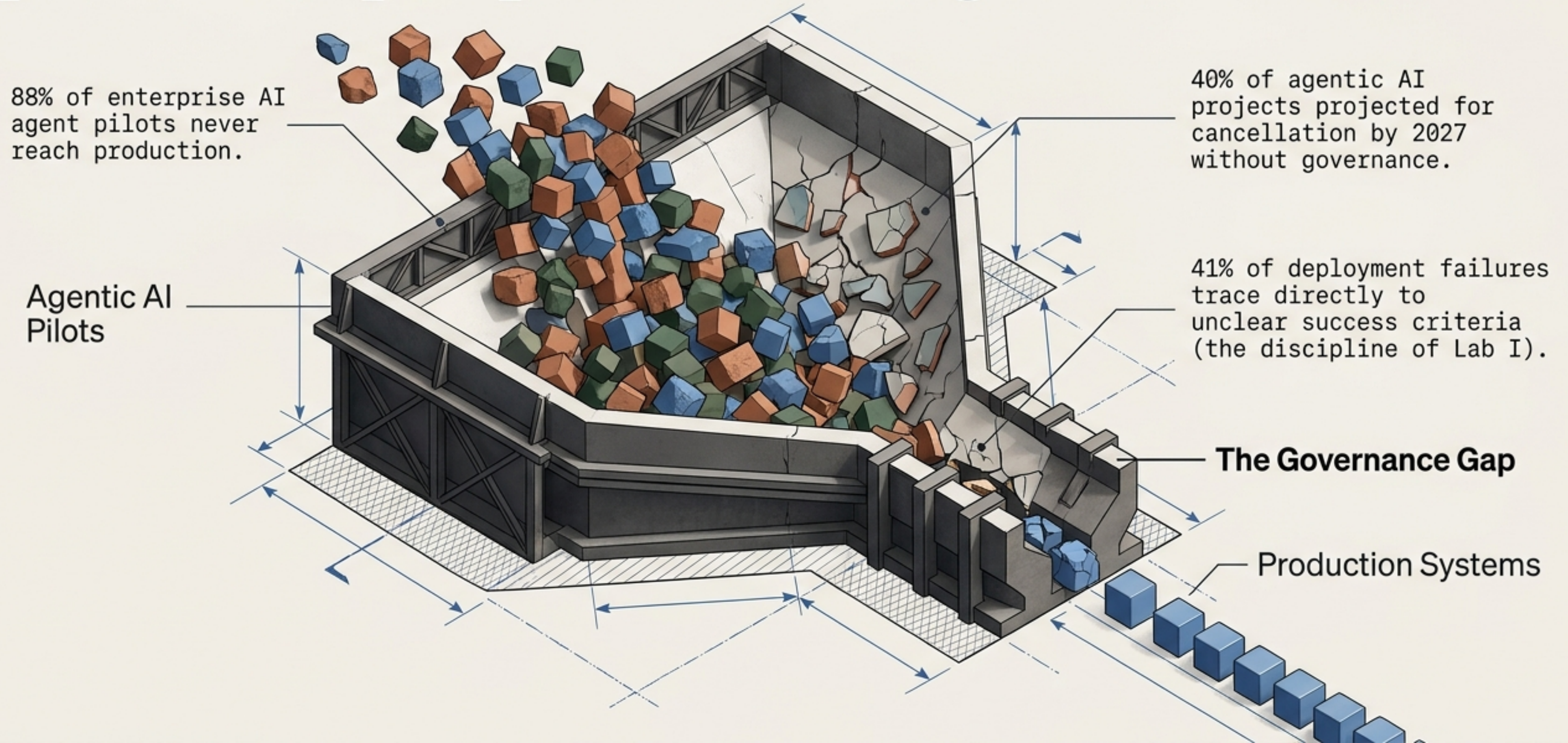

completion certificates.



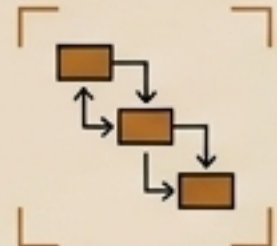
Unchecked claims that

falsifiable by no one.

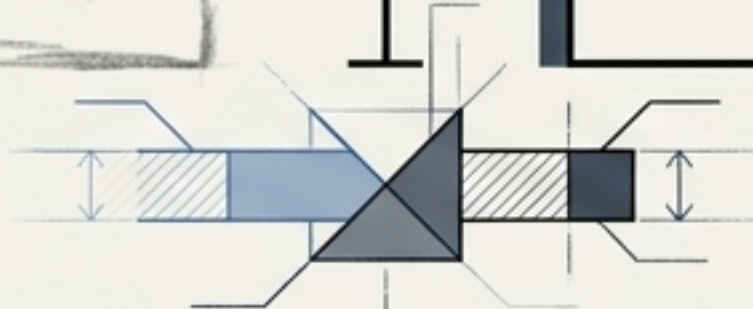

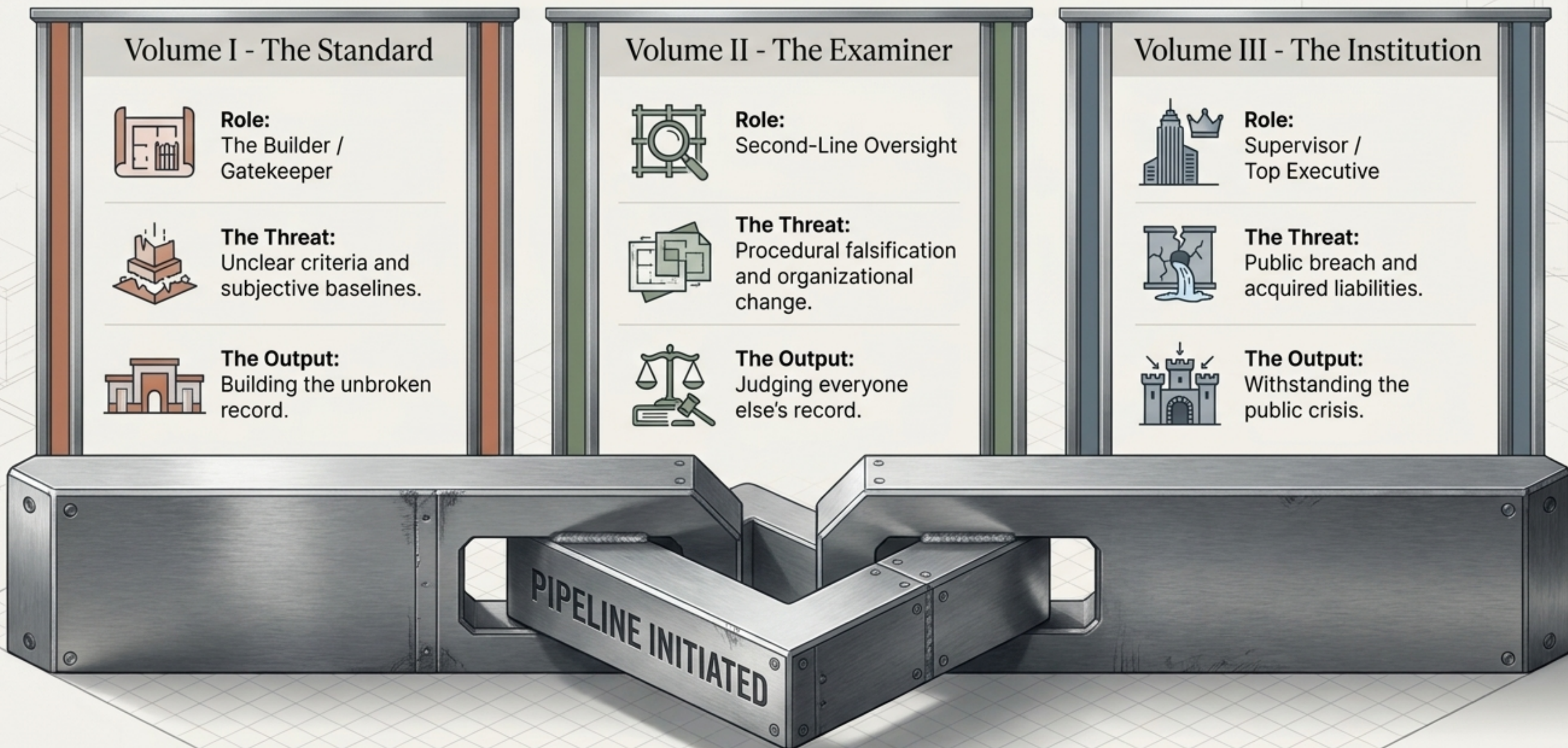

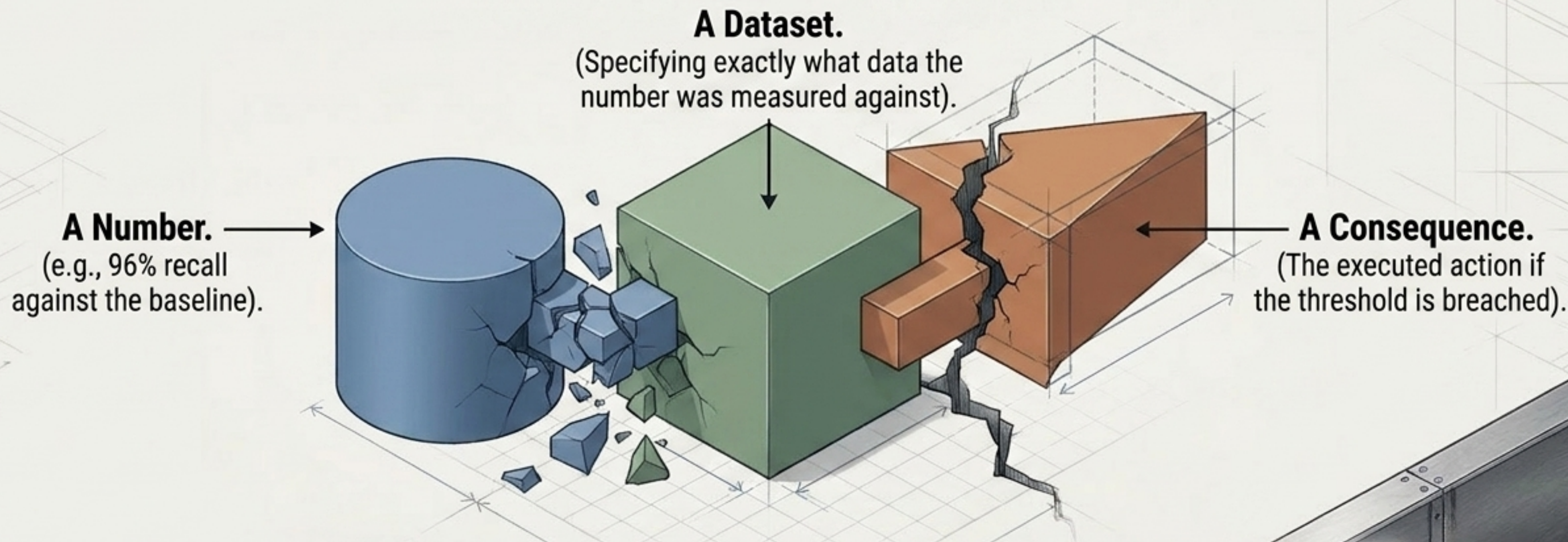

Success criteria survive scrutiny only when three elements lock together.



Everything else is a **press release**. The moment you sign this, it becomes **record**.

LAB I: SEALED

No AI performance claim is testable until the human process has been measured.

The Human Baseline.

1. Work six live alerts from the triage queue exactly as the desk does. Escalate or dismiss. No second looks.

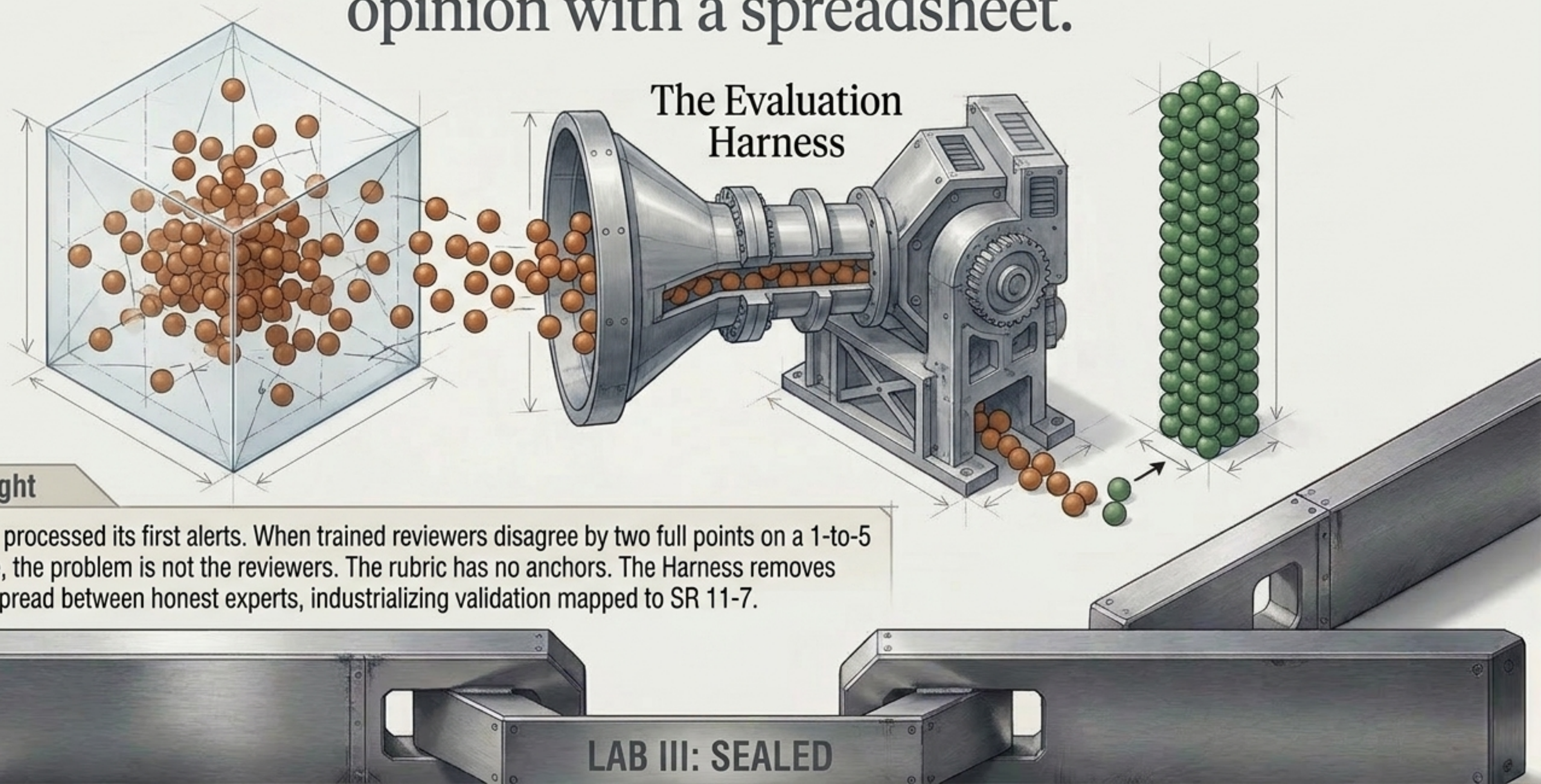
2. The human accuracy score is sealed on the record.

The Machine Test.

3. The machine is required to beat this specific, measured baseline.

LAB II: SEALED

Evaluation without anchors is opinion with a spreadsheet.



Insight

TS-7 processed its first alerts. When trained reviewers disagree by two full points on a 1-to-5 scale, the problem is not the reviewers. The rubric has no anchors. The Harness removes the spread between honest experts, industrializing validation mapped to SR 11-7.

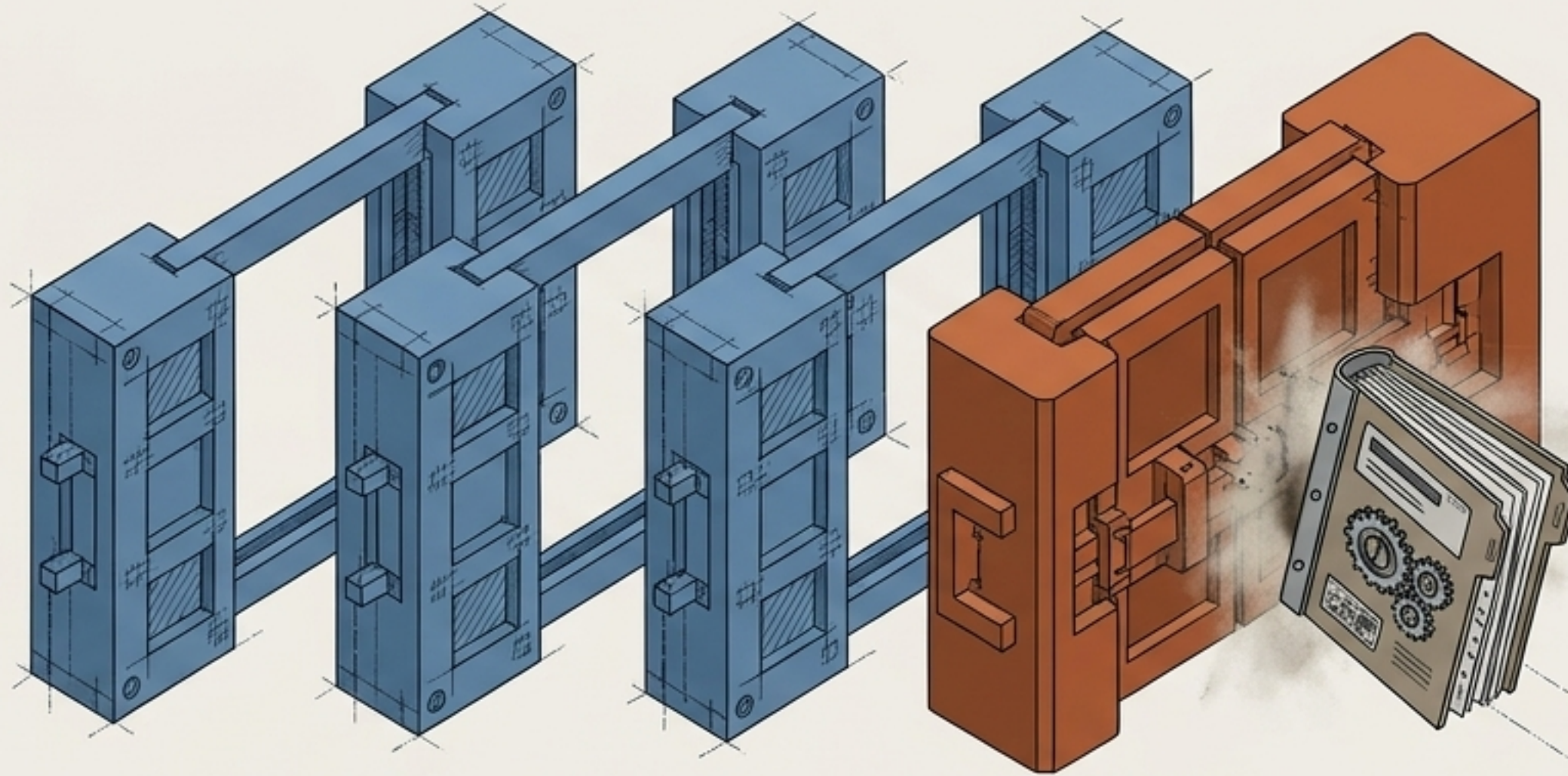
A single unmet condition is a hold, no matter how the dossier reads.

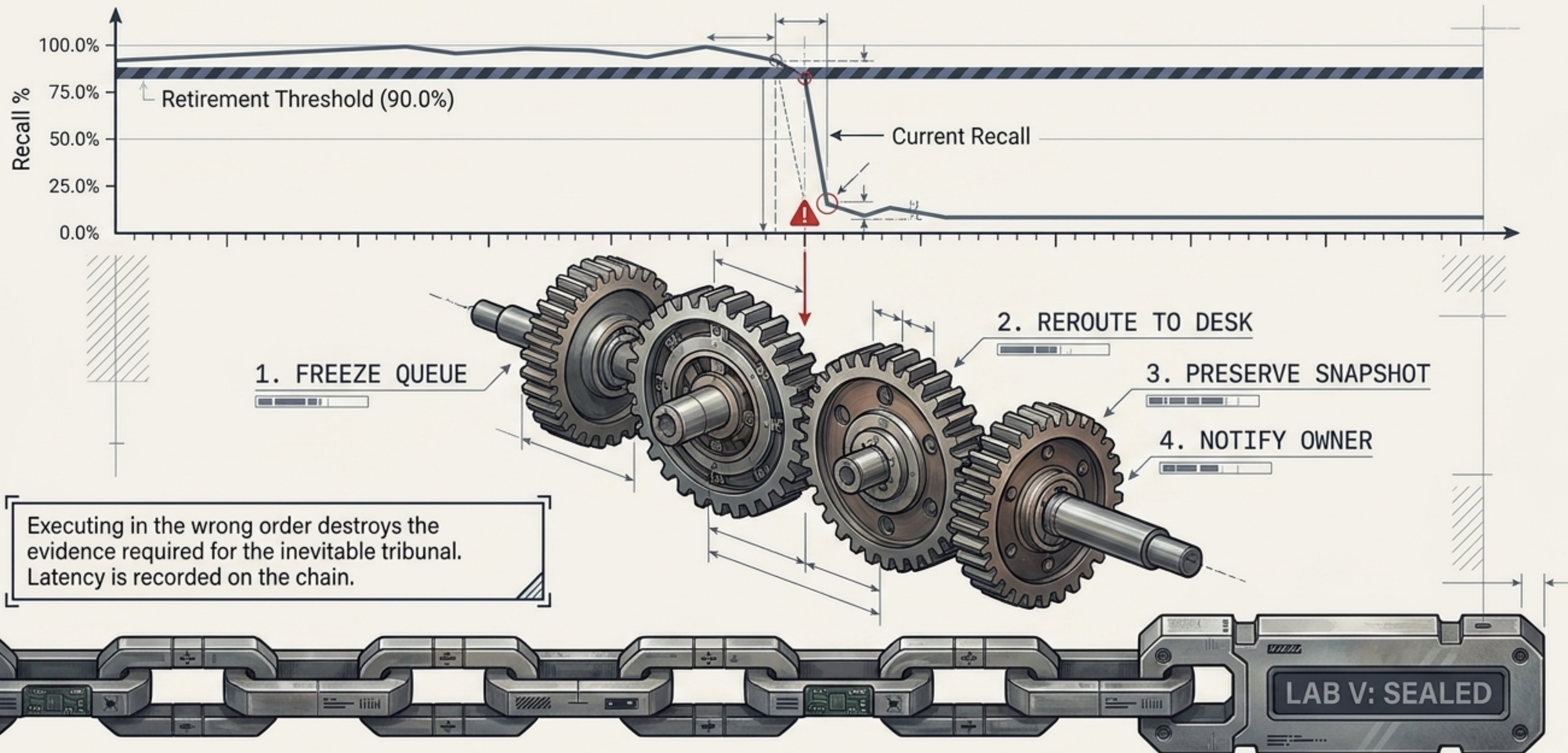

Examinations are withstood from the record, not from the room.

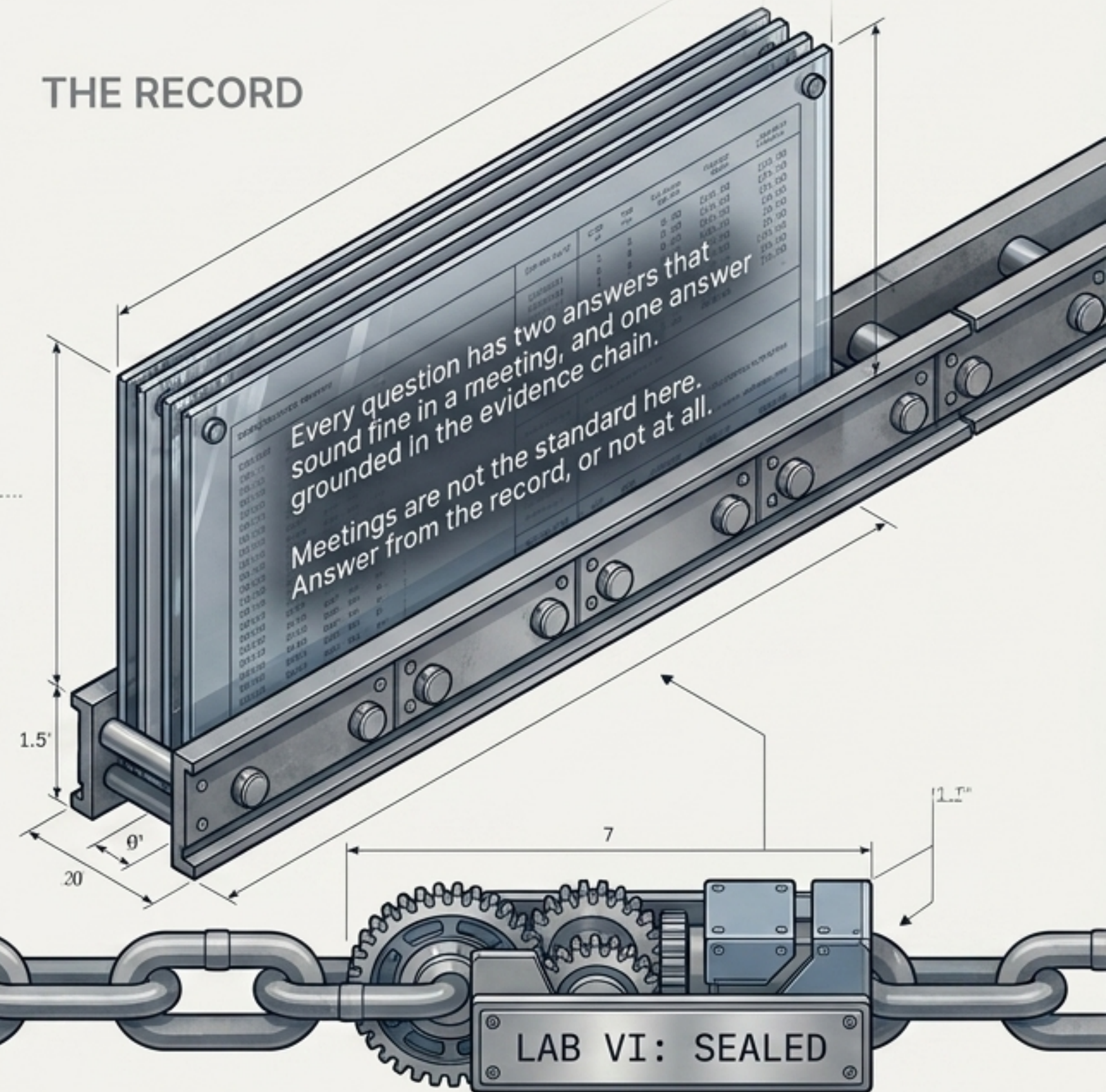
THE ROOM

They are thorough.

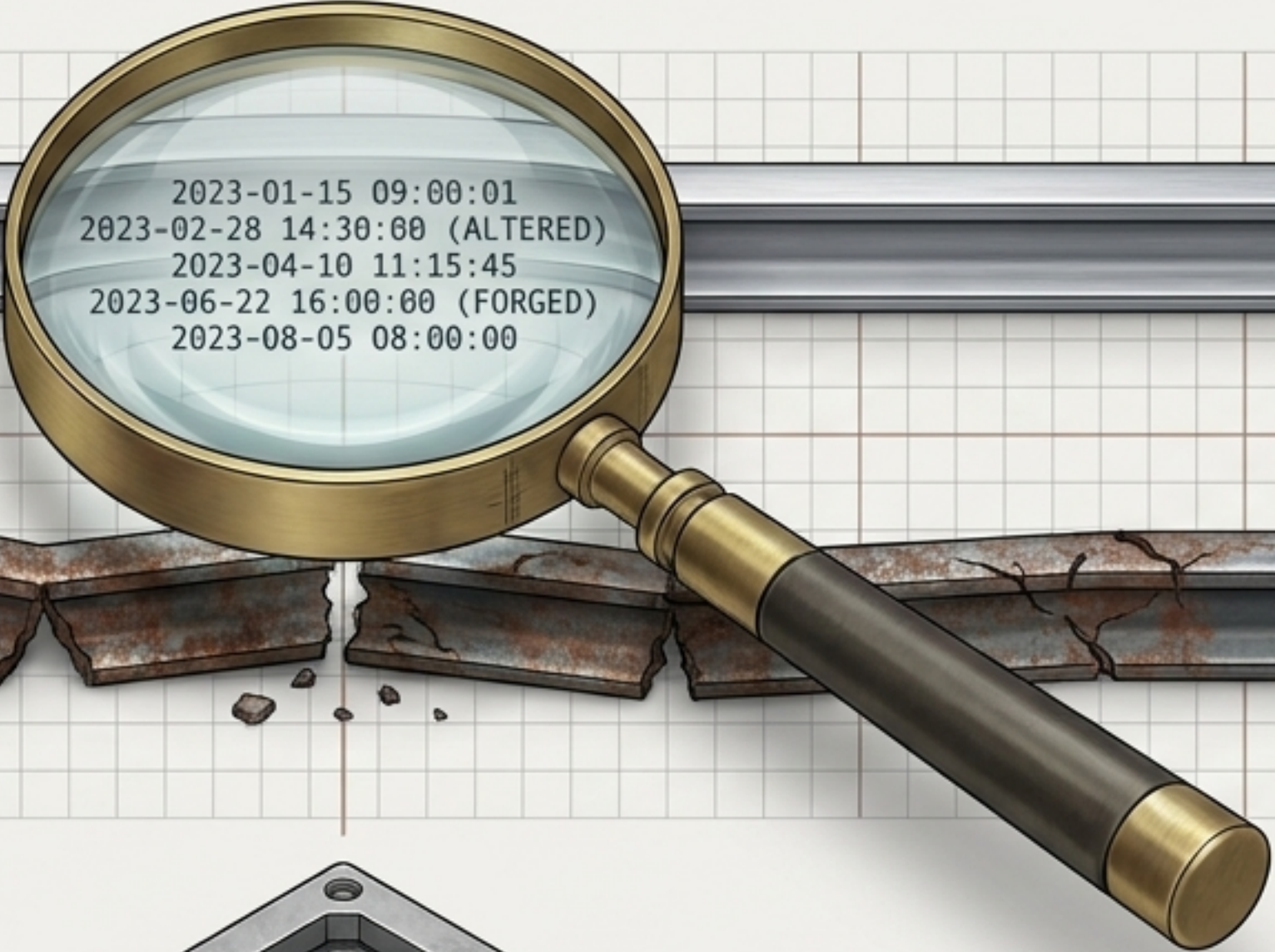


THE RECORD

The Real History

Meridian Trust's agent missed a structuring pattern for nine months.

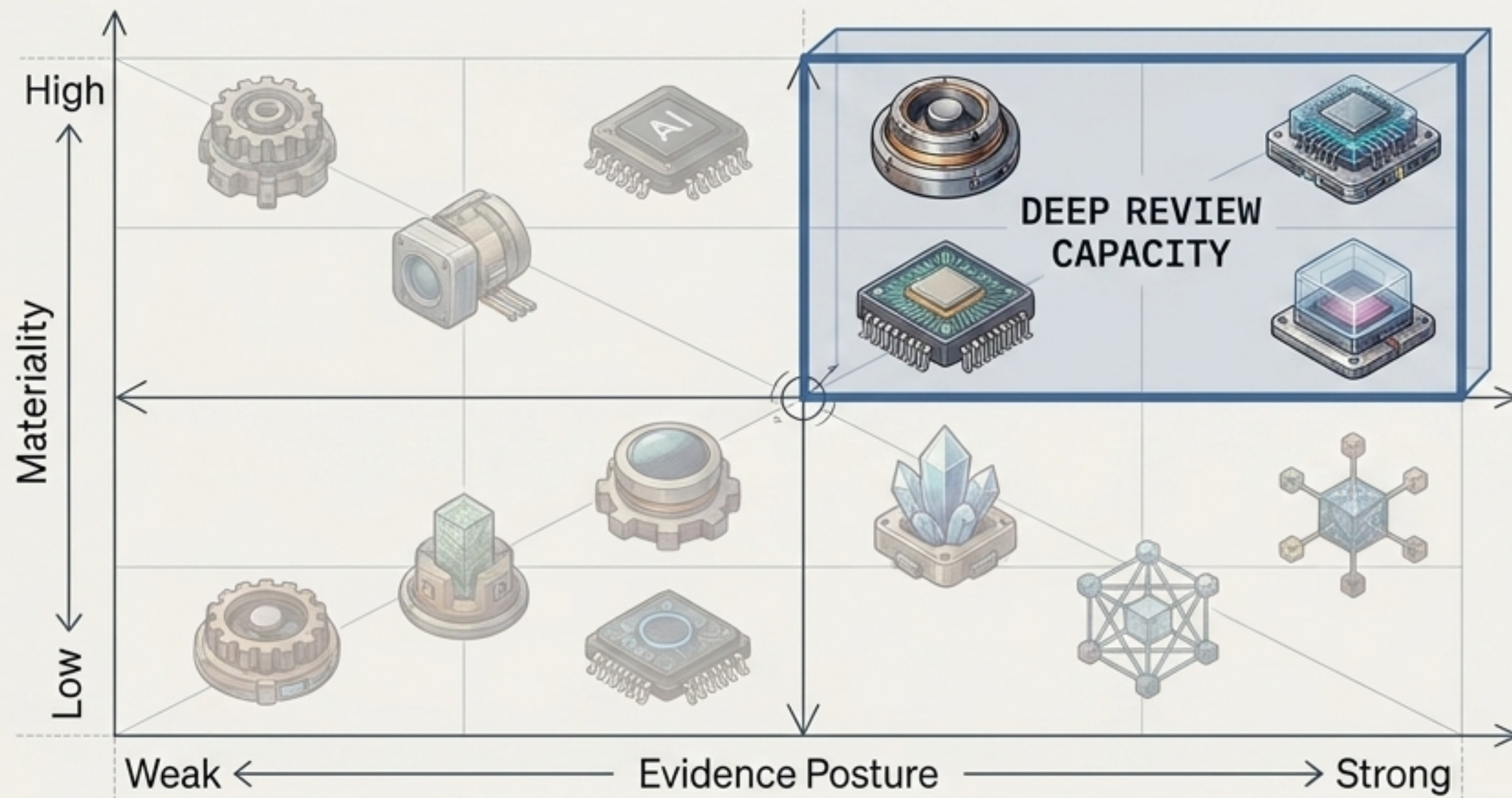
You seize fourteen sealed records. Six are defective. Procedural falsification is procedurally sealed but substantively false.

Two histories cannot both be true, and the mathematics tells you which one is.

Everything after that is reading.



Oversight is a scarce resource. What you do not review is a decision too.

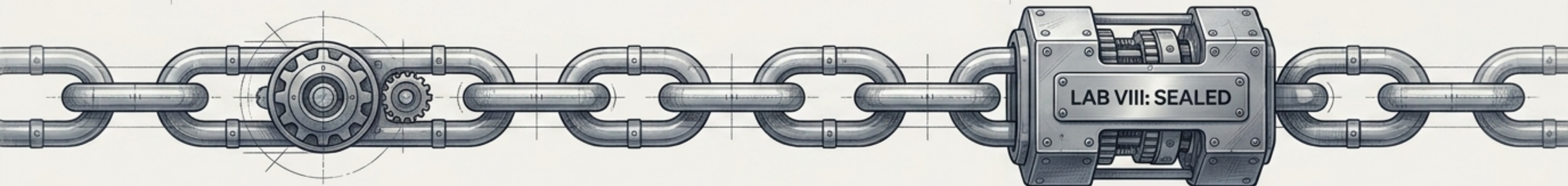


The Constraint:

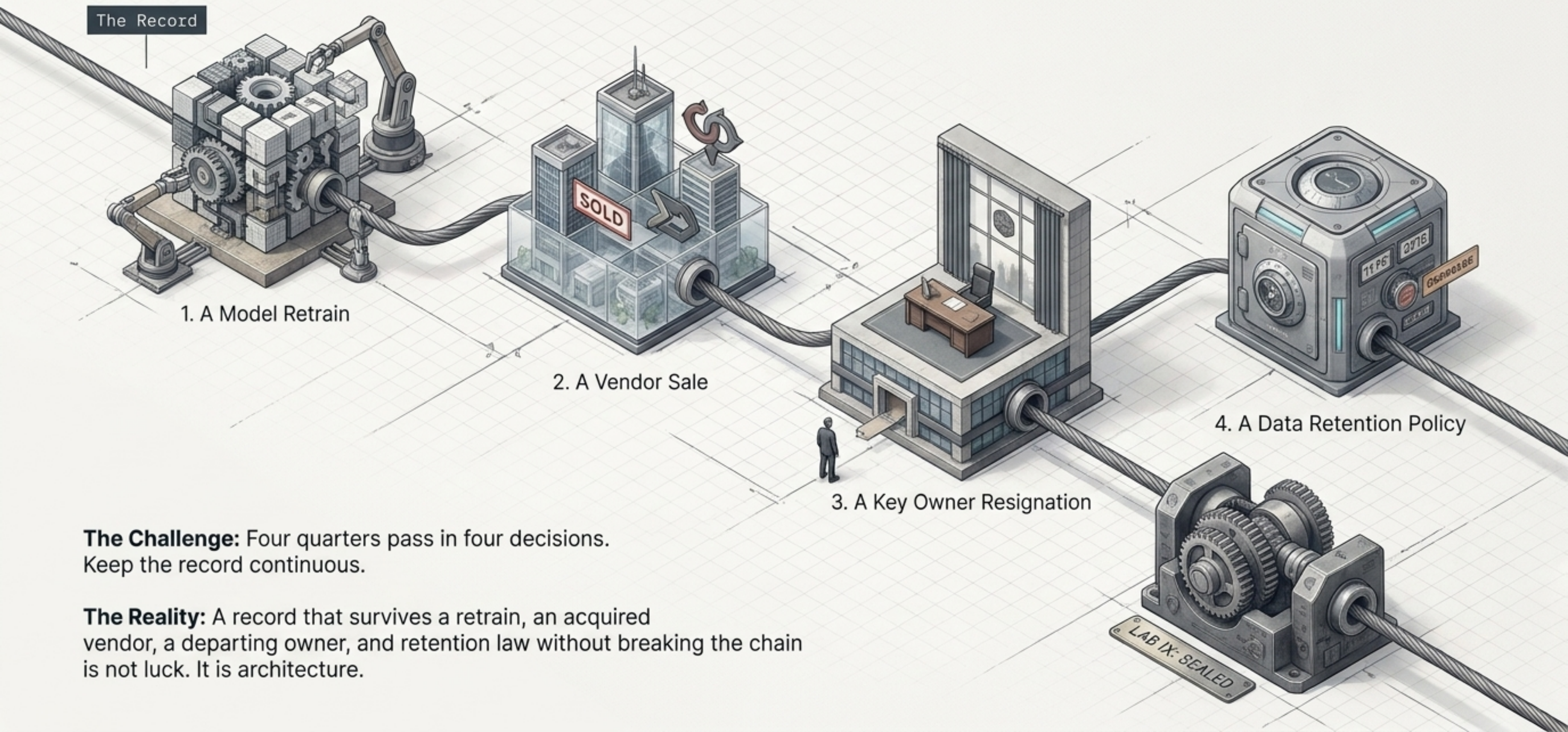
Twelve systems in the estate.
Deep-review capacity for only four.

The Doctrine:

You must tier the estate, commit your hours, and live with what you chose not to look at. When an incident finds your blind spot, your triage rationale on the record is your only survivable answer.



Governance rarely dies in an incident; it dies quietly in an org change.



The Challenge: Four quarters pass in four decisions.
Keep the record continuous.

The Reality: A record that survives a retrain, an acquired vendor, a departing owner, and retention law without breaking the chain is not luck. It is architecture.

In a crisis, the most dangerous document claims more than the record supports.

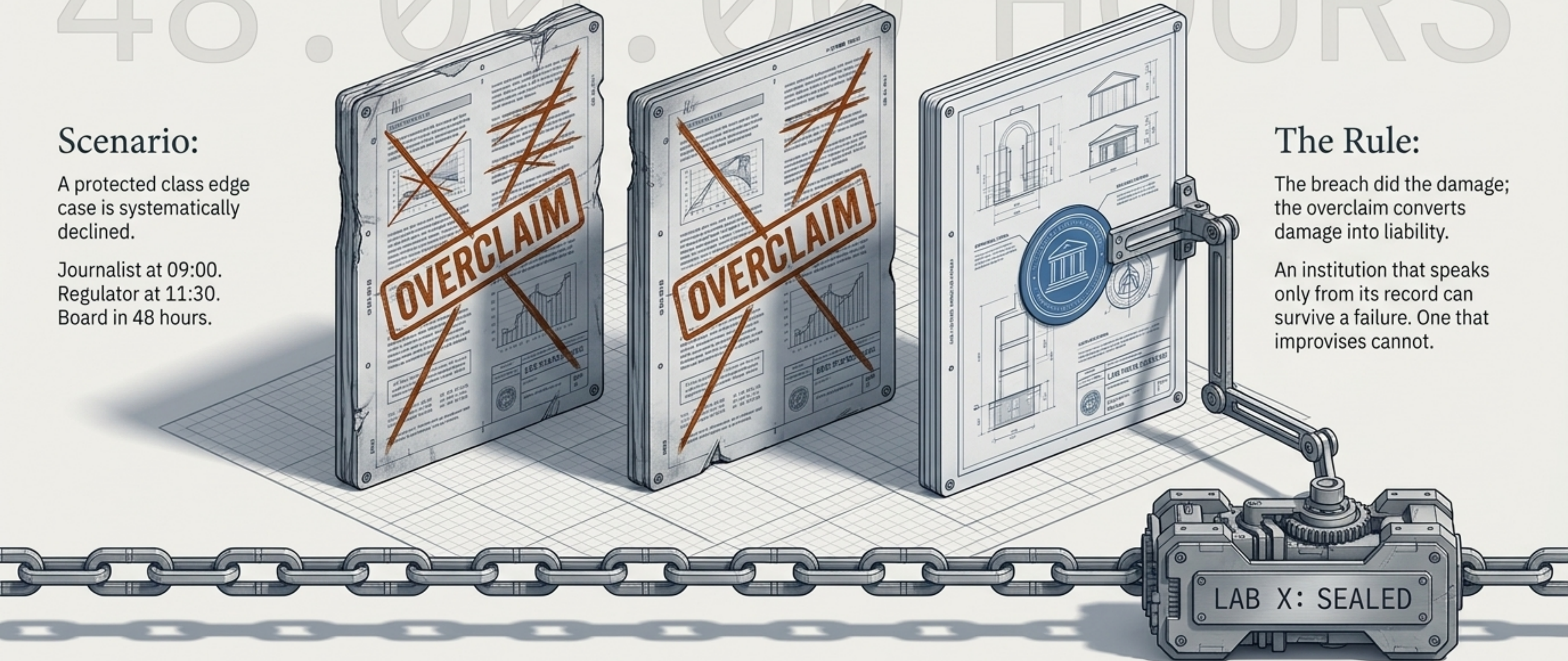

The Rule:

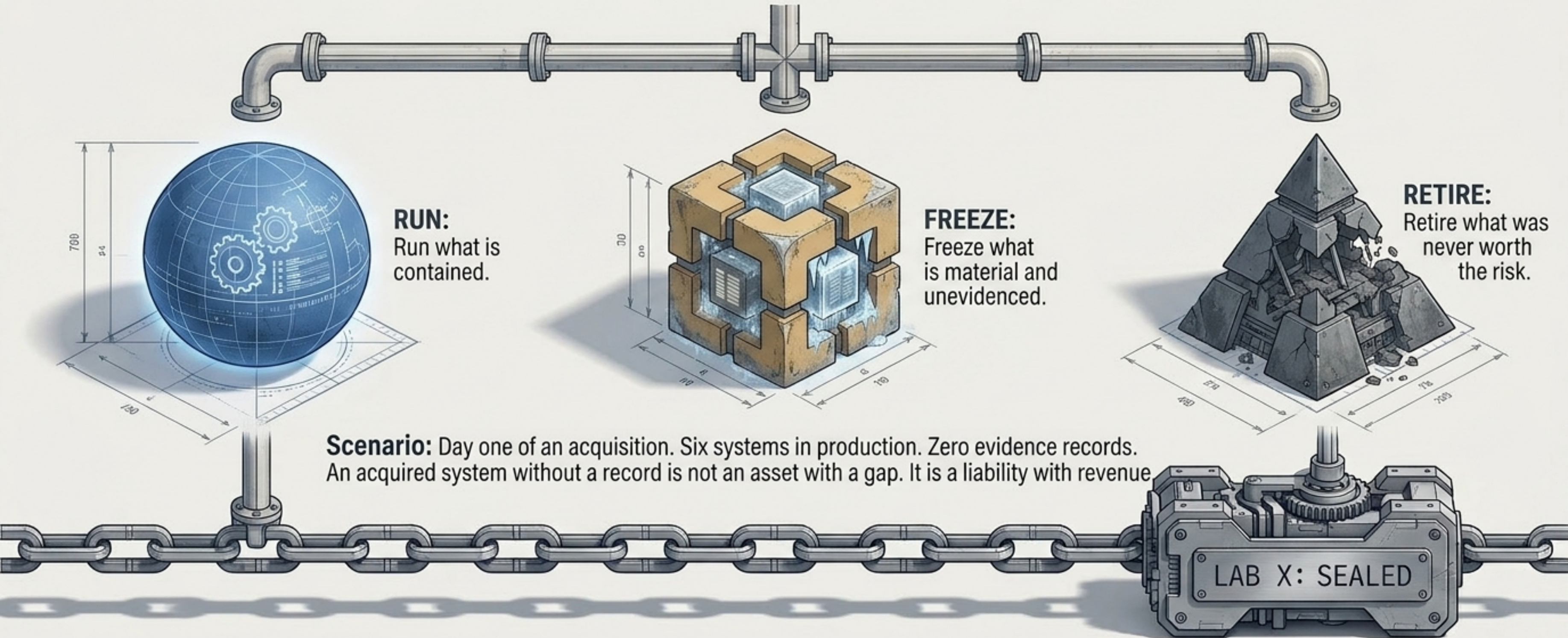
The breach did the damage;

improvises cannot.



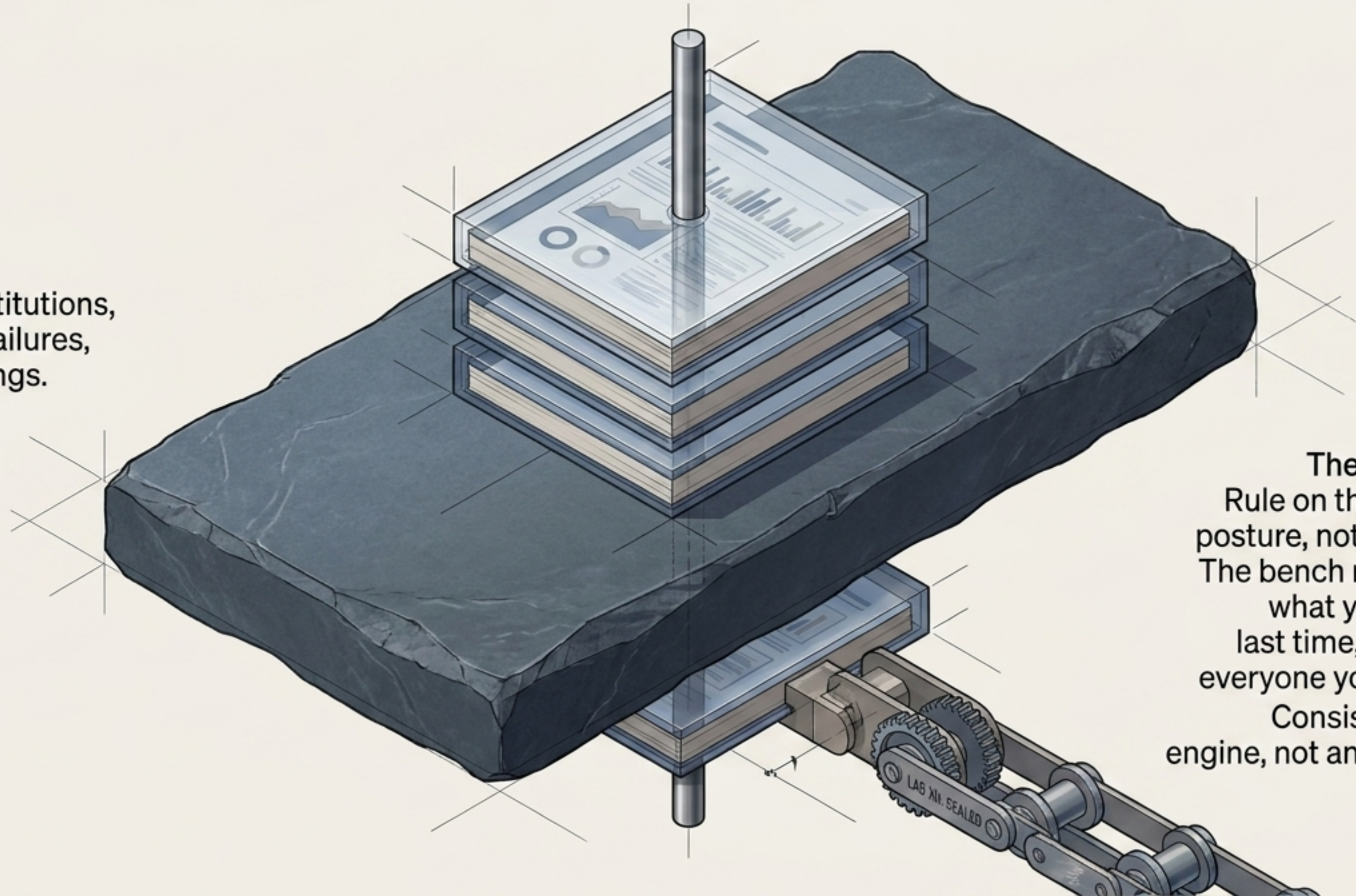
You did not build this estate, but from today its record is your name.

The Test:

The Mandate
